### Visitors flock to enjoy a gardener's delight

Sunny autumn weather, 12 delightful gardens – all different, and three interesting guest presenters attracted huge crowds to the Kandos Gardens Fair. Organisers were absolutely thrilled by the turnout of hundreds of visitors to the district and the great atmosphere over the two days. The opening of the Kandos CWA event on the town square in front of the community centre was packed with people browsing the garden market, consuming CWA tea and scones and drinking coffee on the piazza while being entertained by the Kandos Bellz dancers and the roaming ukulele minstrels. Following the welcome to country by Lyn Syme, Costa Georgiadis also welcomed everyone with a quirky and humorous address emphasising the unique attractions of the town and the importance of community. Wild weed forager Diego Bonetto and writer Fiona Ogilvie also spoke enthusiastically about the popular event.

Garden owners across the district were overwhelmed by the number of visitors who flocked to their gardens during the weekend. From historic rural properties with extensive lawns, native shrubs and stately European trees to fenced-in practical suburban food and flower gardens – there was something for everyone. It was truly a gardener's delight. Organisers were absolutely thrilled by the response from garden owners and visitors who came. They said the whole vibe was so positive and everyone was buzzing afterwards.

During his visit to the district Costa took time out to call in to schools at Glen Alice, Kandos, Rylstone and Lue. He was very engaging with school students and explained how food grows, the difference between fresh food and processed food and how much healthier and cheaper it is for us to grow and eat our own food. Costa was very impressed by projects undertaken by staff and students at the schools and spent a lot of time discussing their plans and giving them some valuable insights into gardening and how to achieve the best results.

At Kandos High School he inspected a well-designed garden project which had been drawn up by the students and was very impressed that a compost bin had been incorporated into the

design. He said compost was a magic ingredient and explained that it needs to be dug into the soil so that the sun and weather don't destroy its life giving properties. Following his inspection he enjoyed a delicious and very healthy lunch prepared by hospitality students. At Rylstone Public School, students had also prepared some healthy treats from their gardens including cucumber, tomatoes and kale chips. Teacher, Mrs Bev Balfourt cooked up a vegetable quiche for everyone as well. Students from across the district enjoyed his visit very much.

During the Kandos luncheon, Cr Martens had the honour of awarding first prize in the Seniors Week Craft Competition to local senior Christine Trejzina who also took out a commended certificate as well.

This year's Senior Award in recognition for her achievements in supporting the community was presented to Magdalena (Maggie) Swientek who after immigrating to Australia in the 1950's was one of the founding members of St. Vincent de Paul in Kandos. Maggie has been an active member of the shop since it began and is one of the oldest and longest serving members of the society. The Rylstone Seniors Week Award for 2016 was presented to Bruce Fleming who moved to the Bylong Valley as a young child and was originally a grader operator with the Rylstone Shire Council. From there he worked in the office at the Kandos cement works and later as an accountant in Lithgow. Over the years, Mr Fleming has been a tireless worker for many groups and associations including the Rylstone-Kandos Rescue Squad and the Kandos Museum where he was patron. He has also been the author of a couple of well researched books on Kandos.

## Queen's Scout

A large gathering of scouts, family members and friends were on hand at the Kandos Scout Hall recently to see Tylanda Murray receive her Queen's Scout Award – the highest youth scouting award achievable in the commonwealth movement of scouting. To achieve this prestigious award a Venturer Scout must be able to set a goal, plan progress towards that goal, organise themselves and others and maintain the determination to overcome difficulties and complete the task. They must also have achieved the Venturing Skills Award and complete the requirements in the four award areas. Each year only a few Venturer Scouts achieve this prestigious award, which is presented by the Governor and Chief Scout of New South Wales, as a representative of the Queen, at Government House. Applicants must achieve their goals before their 18th birthday and during this time Tylanda was studying for the HSC in year 12 at Kandos High School and also undertook the challenge of walking the Kokoda Track in New Guinea.

A number of fellow Queen's Scout recipients were on hand at the presentation including her father Phillip Murray who also achieved his award in Kandos. Tylander said she was proud to follow in her dad's footsteps. "I want to thank my father for being my inspiration. All I ever wanted was to follow in his footsteps to gain the Queen's Scout Award. I also want to thank all those who helped me including my extended family, especially Nan and Pop for being there throughout the journey."

Former Scout Commissioner for NSW, Phil Crutchley from Wollongong who attended the ceremony said his association with Tylanda made an impression on him and the way he feels about scouts. "In this life, with all the distractions of modern youth, she made it her goal to gain her Queen's Scout Award and followed through with it," he said.

### Garden weekend success

Based on ticket sales organisers of the Kandos Gardens Fair estimate that between 600 and 700 visitors, including train passengers from Lithgow, viewed local gardens. Many of the visitors were local, and many came from Mudgee, with others from Newcastle, Bathurst, Dubbo, the Blue Mountains, the Hunter and Sydney. After expenses (including guest speakers, entertainers, accommodation, promotion and printing) the group raised around \$5000 which will be split between keeping a reserve for the next event, donations to the CWA and donations to other community groups. Funds totalling over \$3000 were also raised by and for other community groups including the Kandos Museum, Rylstone Hospital, Rylstone Bowling Club, Rylstone CWA and Ilford - Running Stream CWA. Comments and suggestions from visitors, participants and the community have generally been extremely positive about the event overall. The Saturday Garden Market was popular and well-attended, and the local schools thoroughly enjoyed meeting Costa Georgiadis on the Friday beforehand. "Thanks goes to Kandos Museum which ran two trains on the Saturday (from Lithgow return and then Kandos to Airly return) and provided shuttle buses for the passengers. Their lunch was provided by Rylstone CWA.

"Huge thanks also to the garden owners and their friends and families who put an enormous effort into preparing their gardens and running the show, as well as looking after visitors all weekend.

"Thanks are also due to the many volunteers who helped with the event, including those acting as ticket sellers and gatekeepers across 14 venues. More than 60 people volunteered their time over the weekend."

### Funding for Cottage Museum

The NSW Government is providing more than \$11,000 to help support the Rylstone and District Historical Society's efforts to develop their Cottage Museum. During his recent visit to Rylstone, member for Bathurst Paul Toole said the society has worked tirelessly since 1984 to establish a much respected and popular attraction in the town.

"I want to congratulate the Rylstone and District Historical Society for their efforts over many years to establish, grow and expand the Cottage Museum. It's housed in a simple 1890s weatherboard home built for local blacksmith, James Nash and it provides a fantastic insight into what domestic and rural life was like back then. Displays include costumes, rustic furniture, kitchen and small farming tools, schooling and musical instruments, together with photographs of pioneers, the town and district."

Minister for Regional Development John Barilaro said community groups and societies like the Rylstone and District Historical Society make a significant contribution to local regional communities bringing social, recreational and economic benefits.

A spokesperson for the museum said the funds will allow Rylstone and District Historical Society to create much needed storage and research space at the museum.

"This will allow the Society to create a dedicated area for family history research with adjacent filing and storage cabinets, storage for collection items not on display and space for conservation of items and photographic documentation. The Society is thrilled to have this support from the Department of Industry NSW."

### Wraps are flowing in

Jo Williams from Wrap with Love has been getting almost weekly deliveries of squares and the occasional completed wrap from Mudgee and district libraries through the Kandos Library, as well as other squares dropped off at the Kandos Charity Shop.

"This has been keeping me busy stitching and labelling. So for the first quarter of the year 28 completed wraps have gone off to Sydney for distribution within Australia and to needy destinations around the world. This total so far is 18 wraps more than I had sent off this time last year. Well done all you crafty people out there and keep up the good work."

Mrs Williams says she has several women who are prolific knitters/crocheters but find it difficult to acquire wool supplies for making the squares.

"So donations of wool, to help them keep going, would be gratefully appreciated and can also be dropped off at the libraries or at the Kandos Charity Shop (please mark bags 'Wool for Wrap with Love')."

Knitted or Crocheted squares of 25cms by 25cms size are the easiest to put together for the wraps but all work is accepted. If using size 4 needles and 8 ply wool and casting on 50 stitches and then knitting for 25cms this generally makes the best size square. Use any stitch except stocking stitch (as the knitting won't lie flat). A knitting group still meets on the 1st Tuesday each month at Mudgee Library from 1pm to 3pm.

### Host an Exchange Student

Have you ever thought of hosting a Rotary Exchange Student? The Rylstone Kandos district has the chance to have an 18 year old female American student living in their community for 12 months. However, to be able to take advantage of this opportunity Rotary needs to have local families welcome her into their home for about three months. The exchange will begin in July 2016 and end in July 2017. A Rotary spokesperson said this is a great chance to get to know someone from another country and culture, and to make a friend from another country.

"This is enriching for both the host family and the exchange student. Many people who have hosted students have made life-time friends and have travelled overseas to be a part of the exchange student's life many years later."

An Exchange Student lives in your home and is treated as a part of your family so they can experience what it is like to live in the local community. They go to school here and live the Australian lifestyle. The student is also supported by the local Rotary club and the broader network of Rotary. Rylstone Kandos has a long history of hosting International Exchange Students and the benefits for individuals, the school community and the local community are significant. 
