Lighting the Olympic flame at ADA

The Olympic Games may be in Rio but in the spirit of celebration and good sportsmanship aged care facility ADA Cottage in Kandos held its own ADA 2016 Olympic Games. The event kicked off on Tuesday, August 2 with the opening ceremony – a dazzling affair with the Olympic torch arriving via the streets of Kandos and handed by ADA staff member Lesley Pitt to resident Fay Clarke who amidst much applause lit the Olympic flame. From there it was down to business with drug testing first off the rank to ensure a level playing field for all competitors. The official tester was Kandos resident Stan Challenger who, with a long-time interest in the racehorse industry, was well placed to conduct the tests. He had some help from fluffy toy dog, Sniffer.

After the national anthem 'Tie me Kangaroo Down' everyone enjoyed a delicious morning tea which included two fabulous cakes specially baked for the occasion and decorated with the five Olympic rings. ADA committee chairperson Johanna Marr did the honours and cut the Olympic cake.

Following morning tea, home care worker Sandra Lipscombe who organises community activities at ADA announced there were no drug test positives, so it was down to business with

swimming the first event of the games. On Tuesday, August 9 rhythmic gymnastics and the balance board were the events. The following Tuesday it was the egg and spoon race and Olympic trivia, and the following week synchronised swimming, discuss throwing and the equestrian events. On Tuesday, August 30 the closing ceremony took place with some special words to competitors from ADA manager Heidi O'Neil and the presentation of medals. Then it was party time.

"We heard that another dog show at Harden on the same weekend had around 50 gazebos trashed and completely destroyed so that puts it in perspective. All in all we had a good show with some really outstanding dogs."

Next year's Championship Dog Show will be held around the end of September for the first time. This should be a milder time of the year,

though some exhibitors say they enjoy showing their dogs in winter.

Kandos Museum and Centennial Coal have teamed up to deliver a unique museum exhibit - the box-cut at the now closed Charbon Mine. Dr Buzz Sanderson, president of Kandos Museum said this is truly exciting.

"Through our collaboration with Centennial Coal we are able to offer a unique experience where we will be able to take museum visitors to the mine and deliver a full scale, hands on look into what lies beneath the surface of mother earth."

The box-cut at Charbon Mine was commenced in the late 1980's under the direction of mine manager Bill Irvine to give access to the Lithgow seam which is the dominant seam of commercial interest in the Kandos area.

Dr Sanderson said there has been quite a lot of detail to work through to get these tours underway and it has been a pleasure to partner with Centennial Coal on this project. Tours of the box cut will be available through the Kandos Museum. For more information visit the museum's website at kandosmuseum.org.au.

Winter barbecue at KRR

Kandos Rylstone Community Radio (KRR 98.7FM) held its mid-year barbecue and get-together for members and their families recently in the landscaped rear garden of their station in Angus Avenue Kandos. They struck it lucky with the weather and enjoyed a sunny winter afternoon with plenty of chat about broadcasting, music and local programs. KRR's president, Brent Barlow said it's a way of thanking the volunteers of the station for providing such a great service to the community.

"All our members are volunteers and many of them, especially our committee and office bearers put a lot of time and effort into keeping the station on air, updating equipment and renovating our building. We hold two barbecues a year - one in winter and the other in December before Christmas. It's a nice way for members to keep in touch," he said.

Since the association bought the dilapidated building many years ago they have completely stripped the interior and built two state-of-the-art broadcasting studios, a modern transmitter room and refurbished the kitchen. They have also transformed the backyard area into landscaped gardens and an equipment shed with a rainwater tank attached. Current projects include the re-flooring and carpeting of the station's meeting room in time for the hosting of the regional community radio station group's annual meeting in September, when KRR will welcome broadcasters from Dubbo, Wellington, Gilgandra, Coonabarabran and Dunedoo.

If anyone would like to become a member and present their own program they can call into the station at 50 Angus Avenue, Kandos and pick up a membership form or come along to a meeting held on the last Wednesday of each month in the station at 7.30pm. Training is provided and it's a lot easier than you think. Check out the station's new-look website by typing in KRR FM.

An inspiring art exhibition

A big crowd attended the art exhibition opening 'In Bed Together' at Kandos Projects on August 5 featuring 12 participating artists, Virginia Handmer and Geoffrey Payne, Na Lan and Reginald Buckland, Mr and Mrs Brown, Georgina Pollard and Alex Wisser, Libby Varcio and Leo Cremonese, Solange Kershaw and Damian Castaldi. Local artist Terry Burrows who coordinated the exhibition said he was very happy with the opening and the huge turnout of people who came along.

"It's everything I hoped for and the fact that it's open for a month is good for the town too. I've enjoyed the whole process," he said. "It's actually motivated me to get back to my own work again."

Some of the art works at this exhibition were not only fascinating but awe inspiring. For example, a 1946 typewriter attached to a computer screen in a small booth had everyone intrigued. The unusual work called Type Over Time was put together by Damian Castaldi and Solange Kershaw who bought the typewriter off E-bay and used a micro controller attached to a sensor to convert mechanical to digital signal. A webcam then captured your face and as you typed in your story it filled up your image on the computer screen with words. The exhibition remained open to the public until August 28.

A classic event at Rylstone

Over 100 classic cars— most of them Mini Minors, overnighed in Rylstone during their annual Rylstone Classic event. It was the main feature of the two-day trek from Newcastle to Bathurst, and dinner at the Globe Hotel included the presentation of the perpetual trophy along with the Rylstone Cup. Rally organiser Evan Redman said the event is based on the famous Monte Carlo Rally and this year they were also celebrating the 50 years anniversary of racing at Mt Panorama, where coincidentally Minis took out the first nine places.

"We've had a fabulous event so far with over 100 cars – almost double last year's number and everything from race cars to pristine show cars. We've even got a very nice Porsche here and all of our vehicles have the little Rylstone Classic grill plates attached."

The early start from Newcastle on Saturday morning meant the convey had time to call into the new Gosford Car Museum which has \$70 million worth of vehicles on display. From there it was a tour of the Hunter wineries and then a slow trip through the beautiful Bylong Valley to Rylstone.

"That last leg of our trip through the Bylong Valley with its rich farming land and sandstone escarpments catching the afternoon sun was a highlight. Especially for the entries from Queensland and Victoria who haven't been on this rally before."

Local onlookers were out in force on Sunday morning for a look at the cars before they took off for Bathurst and a slow lap or two around Mt Panorama. Evan Redman said it was another classic Rylstone adventure.

"We've all had a wonderful time. There were a few rough patches whenever a vehicle broke down or got a flat tire. But to be honest, the hardest thing was finding accommodation for our big group. We booked everything out and verandahs and hallways became a welcome last resort for some," he said.

Shop owner retires after 51 years

Kandos's longest serving shopkeeper Alan Jackson is calling it a day after 51 years in his main street store - Alan Jackson's General Store and 5 Star Supermarket. Although the news has come as a shock to local people, Alan says he's looking forward to it now.

"I made my mind up and that's it. I want to do more things in my life."

Alan has been a part of the local streetscape since he started working in 1965 at the age of 15 for the then owner Bob Roth who owned at least six stores across the region under the banner of RA Roth. Two of the stores were in Kandos, two in Mudgee and one each in Rylstone, Dunedoo and Coolah. In those 51 years, Alan has seen a lot of changes.

"Ninety percent of the original type of goods aren't around anymore. We've also moved from rail freight to road, pre-packaging instead of bulk and the change from cash register to scanning machines. Eftpos was also introduced and these days has a much bigger share of business than cash."

When he first started working, everything came into the shop in bulk and his job was to weigh up all the goods. After he got his driver's licence he delivered groceries to Kandos, Clandulla, Charbon and the cement works quarry. In those early days he worked under the store manager Tom Moss and eventually became the manager himself. In 1982 Alan bought the business from Mr Roth and then eight or so years later bought the building. He then set about restoring the shop to its original condition for the town parade that was held in the 90's. He erected an awning at the front, concreted all the floors and built an extension on the back.

He certainly deserves a well-earned retirement. Most days he's at the shop at 5am and closes at 5.30pm, seven days a week. The early start meant he caught employees on the way to work for their early shift looking for morning tea. The closure of the Charbon cement works, then the Kandos coal mine, followed by the Kandos cement works and Charbon mine have had a dramatic effect on business.

"With each of these closures there was a fall-off in business. This affected all business owners in Kandos."

Alan says he has no immediate plans, other than walking out of the shop in around a month's time. He's got the building on the market but has given up trying to sell the business.

"It's hard to sell a business these days, but I'm not worried. I'm just looking forward to being able to do whatever I like. I've got no immediate plans but if I want to get in the car and go somewhere I'll just go. I'd like to do a trip around Australia sometime," he said.

Fish on the table at RDES AGM

The Rylstone District Environment Society held its Annual General Meeting recently and all previous office bearers were re-elected to their positions. They are: President – Buzz Sanderson, Vice-President – Jorgen Andersen, Secretary – Jenny More and Treasurer – John Medcalf. During the meeting, discussions were held on the almost completed Cudgegong River tree planting project – a current project funded by a Recreational Fishing Trust grant through the Department of Primary Industries (DPI) to improve fish habitat along the river. This nearly completed phase of the project began when funding of \$23,912 was awarded from the DPI in 2014. Work was substantially completed by April 2016 and the final report on the project has been lodged and accepted by the DPI.

Environment society members thanked volunteer Carolyn Barlow who carried out this work including project management, sourcing plants, supervising contractors, liaising with the DPI, MWRC and the Green Army, and planting and weeding. The project covered four sites and in this latest round over 1700 trees have been planted by The Green Army and RDES volunteers. At Tindale Park to the Rylstone golf course Robinias, blackberry and old pines have been removed and 250 trees planted. At the creek behind Rylstone Club, poplars have been removed and 200 trees planted along the creek line. West of the showground, between the two bridges, tree planting and weed removal have taken place and west of the Rylstone water treatment plant 800-900 trees were planted in this round.

Mrs Barlow said thanks are due to The Green Army and Mid-Western Regional Council for their support and donation of trees.

"We have seen a big improvement in water quality over the past few years resulting in a healthy fish habitat and lots of interest by recreational fishers. Platypus also continue to be seen along the river by visitors and locals alike and that's a great sign."

The current strong flow in the river following recent rain brings the possibility of fish migration upstream from Windamere Dam which has been well-stocked with Golden Perch and Murray Cod.


