### ADA Cottages' amalgamation with RSL LifeCare a positive for community

After weeks of discussion and deliberation the board and management of Rylstone Kandos Aged and Disabled association, operating as the aged care facility ADA Cottage in Kandos, has resolved to amalgamate services with RSL LifeCare, one of the largest senior living services in Australia. The decision was announced at two information meetings on Monday, September 12 – one for staff at 2pm and the other for residents and family members at 5.30pm. Board Chairperson Johanna Marr said a number of options were considered.

"Each management committee since early 2000 understood that an aged care facility with less than 40 beds was not a viable option. This figure is now 60 beds." With just 20 beds, ADA faced a dilemma. Merging with regional facilities in Mudgee was considered and attempted in June 2013, but later withdrawn. "In seeking a solution, the committee was conscious of the warm and friendly culture within the facility and the strong dedication staff members have towards the organisation. This required the committee to seek an organisation with similar philosophy, a strong commitment to aged care and a sound corporate and clinical governance structure, as well as more than adequate financial resources that will support the organisation to grow and prosper," Mrs Marr said.

After meeting with Ron Thompson - CEO of RSL LifeCare and Anne Kauffmann - Clinical Governance, ADA's management committee was presented with two options:

1. To access the infrastructure of RSL LifeCare for a period of time, without costs.
2. To amalgamate with RSL LifeCare, retain ADA's name and retain its financial assets as well as securing its staff positions.

At a full committee meeting, the majority of members voted for the second option. Mrs Marr said she was expecting some negativity from staff and residents but the reaction was positive.

"We always fought against this. It's something we always resisted, but to be honest the paperwork was drowning us and there have been more cuts to funding and more legislative changes, making it impossible for small facilities. When we looked at it realistically, the positives outweighed trying to stay independent. The

decision has taken a huge weight off the board's shoulders," she said.

Two of the positives include the retention of the 27 staff positions – a huge plus for the community with a wage bill of over one million dollars per annum, and the quarantining of all money raised by ADA, allowing it to be available and used by ADA. Plans are already underway for a large pergola to be built in the courtyard. This is a massive project and will be a great asset for ADA and its residents. Another major benefit will be improved educational and training opportunities for staff. They will also be able to transfer to other facilities easily if they move from the area. Mr Thompson from RSL LifeCare said they all want ADA Cottage to remain a community facility for local people.

"We will maintain and cherish the local community focus, preserve the ADA name, ensure that the homelike environment with a family focus will continue under RSL LifeCare, and provide improved educational and training opportunities for staff. We are an award winning organisation with 10 "Better Practice in Aged Care" awards from the Aged Care Standards & Agency – no other organisation has received this number of awards."

The current management board of ADA will hand over to an advisory committee from October 18. It will then be there for the transition to amalgamation.

### New fire truck in Kandos

Fire protection and emergency response in Kandos has received a boost with the recent arrival of a new Isuzu Fire Truck. Member for Bathurst Paul Toole who paid a visit to the Kandos Fire Station said it was great to see the fire truck, referred to as a 'Class 2' pumper, now in operation at the station.

"With the summer season approaching it's sure to be of great assistance when fires in the area are most prevalent. The 'Class 2' fire truck will increase the capacity of Fire & Rescue NSW (FRNSW) firefighters to deal with fires, accidents, chemical spills and other emergencies," Mr Toole said.

The newer model Isuzu truck has an automated manual transmission which makes it easier to drive and a better braking system to provide increased safety for firefighters. Additionally, the equipment stowage configuration has been optimised to enable safe and easy access to firefighting equipment.

"The Kandos fire and rescue crews led by Captain Peter Taylor and Deputy Captains Kevin Walsh and Brett Maker do a tremendous job responding to fires and other emergencies as well as actively promoting fire safety in the community,"

Mr Toole said.

## Cementing an industrial history

Kandos Museum was a hive of activity recently with the installation of a ropeway tower standing over seven metres tall as part of the new outdoor display area. The tower was previously part of Cement Australia's unique bucket system which delivered limestone from the quarry to the cement plant. It has now been placed opposite Number 3 Ball Mill and is central to the planned display. Museum president Buzz Sanderson said despite consistent rain in recent weeks, everything went to plan.

"In the main we managed to dodge the rain and get the ropeway tower up. When complete, the museum will have all three types of ropeway bucket on display. It's great to see this acknowledgement of what was such an important technology, such an important contribution to Kandos and industry. The ropeway really did make it all possible given the steep exit out of the quarry," Dr Sanderson said.

The Museum's collection of girth gears has also come out of storage. The girth gears were donated by Cement Australia to the museum two years ago but were put into storage while building works were completed.

"These are beautiful in their own right, but the gears tell a much bigger story of how important the cement plant was not only to Kandos but to the nation."

The larger of the gears from No 4 Raw Mill weighs 6000kg per half and is on display in the front garden of the museum while the small gear weighing in at 1350kg per half is on display near the entrance to the museum. Dr Sanderson extended a big thank you to Maceco and CGB Services for their help with storage, transport and installation. Kandos Museum is open 10am to 4pm Wednesdays to Sundays.

## Public forum – Futurelands2

The use and care of land is one of the most important issues we face today as a society. A public forum, Futurelands2 will be held in Kandos on November 12 and 13 exploring our changing relationship to land. Futurelands2 is hosted by Cementia Inc and the Kandos School of Cultural Adaptation (KSCA) in partnership with MECO at Wollongong University and Sydney College of the Arts, the University of Sydney. The forum will gather farmers, artists, custodians and scholars in the heart of regional NSW to lead this essential discussion, and invites visitors to engage in novel ways with the region's natural and farming environments.

"We are bringing together speakers who are doing very interesting things in very different areas of investigation and facilitating a conversation between them," local co-organiser Alex Wisser said. "Local farmers, agricultural innovators, soil scientists, Indigenous historians and custodians, economists, entrepreneurs, writers and artists will explore the future of our relationship to land through discussions, tours, demonstrations and food," he said.

The weekend forum will feature a guided tour of Marloo, Mt Marsden - a degraded property being regenerated by Stuart and Megan Andrews employing Natural Sequence Farming techniques. This farming method was invented by Stuart's father Peter Andrews at the Bylong Valley horse stud, Tarwyn Park, which featured a number of times on Australian Story.

The Marloo tour will also include The Hemp Initiative, the first land-based art residency of the newly-formed Kandos School of Cultural Adaptation (KSCA), developed in partnership with Stuart Andrews. The partnership is enabling artist Gilbert Grace to grow and harvest a crop of hemp that will be used to make artworks for the Cementa17 art festival. The venue for Futurelands 2 is the Kandos Community Hall and surrounds. Tickets are expected to sell out quickly. For bookings, go online at <http://ksca.land/futurelands/bookings/>. ## Mountain bikes at Clandulla

Round 3 of the Central West Inter Club Mountain Bike Race Series was held at the Clandulla State Forest near Kandos recently. It's the first time that the local mountain bike club have hosted a race here and organiser Dave Stanfield said it was an exciting day.

"The race went very well. We had a total of 43 riders from Lithgow, Western Sydney, the Blue Mountains, Bathurst, Orange, Dubbo and Mudgee, and all the riders were very happy with the challenging course. There were some really interesting bikes here too."

Dave said it's the fastest growing sport in Australia at the moment and the local club was keen to promote the district's impressive trails.

"I've been looking forward to getting this going. It's great publicity for the trails in this area. We've had some very good feedback from this event," he said. "This particular trail through the forest and down towards Carwell Creek is really beautiful, but quite challenging as well."

The 14 km loop through the forest may have been challenging, but next year, as well as a couple other events, the club is planning a 50km race. This is guaranteed to create a lot of interest from riders across the region and beyond. Winner of the solo male category at Clandulla was Dan Watson from Bathurst who also took out the King of Clandulla trophy for fastest lap. Christine Porter won Queen of Clandulla for her fastest ladies' lap. It was a top day all round with Kandos Public School benefitting through the P&C's barbecue and food stall and a generous donation of \$500 to Ilford Public School by the local mountain bike club.


